211 provides callers with information about and referrals to social services for every day needs and in times of crisis. For example, 2-1-1 can offer access to the following types of services:

- <u>Basic Human Needs Resources</u> including food and clothing, shelters, housing, utility assistance.
- <u>Disaster Response and Recovery</u> works with the emergency management team during a disaster to offer support and place for dissemination of information.
- <u>Mental Health and Health Resources</u> including counseling, support groups, drug and alcohol treatment, health insurance programs, Medicaid and Medicare, maternal health resources, health insurance programs for children, medical information lines, clinics, and hospitals.
- <u>Employment Supports</u> including job training, employment services, transportation assistance and education programs.
- <u>Older Adults and Persons with Disabilities</u> including adult day care, community meals, respite care, home health care, transportation and homemaker services.
- <u>Children, Youth and Family Support</u> including childcare, after school programs, educational programs for low income families, family resource centers, and recreation programs, mentoring, tutoring and protective services.
